### The seminar

As part of the Nautical Institute's 50th Anniversary celebrations and in line with the theme of "Maritime Leadership In a Changing World", the London Branch has organised a one-day conference on board HQS *Wellington* on the River Thames.

Technological and regulatory changes continue to provide challenges for the maritime industry and some longstanding challenges are still of concern. What are these challenges and how will they affect the future of the industry? In adapting to these changes who will provide that leadership and what type of leadership is needed? The conference will explore four principal areas which continue or are likely to play an important role in the future of the maritime world: Environment, Autonomous Ships, Criminalisation and The Role of the Seafarer. Speakers from OneOcean, MCA, UKP&I/TT Club and Steamship Mutual will give presentations aimed at increasing delegates' understanding of the issues involved. Delegates will be invited to participate by way of informal Question & Answer sessions aimed at allowing differing points of view to be exchanged.
